


Spring has sprung at Berkeley Square!

Westover's Fun Facts about Our Residents!

1. **Dr. Charlton Mabry** is a retired Pediatrician from the University of Kentucky Hospital. Mabry Syndrome is named for him after his findings and research. Mabry Syndrome is a condition characterized by intellectual disability, distinctive facial features, increased levels of an enzyme called alkaline phosphatase in the blood (hyperphosphatasia), and other signs and symptoms. People with Mabry Syndrome have intellectual disability that is often moderate to severe. Due to Dr. Mabry's dedicated research, a wing was named in his honor at the University of Kentucky Hospital.
2. **Ann Meier** was married to Tom Kindness, who was a member of the United States House of Representatives, representing Ohio from January 2, 1975-January 3, 1987.
3. **Shirley Rudd** was a Librarian for Lakota Jr. High School. It was the first school to have computerized check out for all of their library books. This system is used today in all libraries.
4. **Patricia Whittlesey** was a model for local clothing stores in the Tri-State area. She modeled clothing at the Netherlands Hotel in Downtown Cincinnati where she would mix and mingle with the lunch crowds and tell them about her beautiful outfits.
